Please note that a special policy applies for articles published under the Oxford Open initiative - see below.

When uploading an accepted manuscript to a repository, authors should include a credit line (see below) and a link to the final published version of the article. * Definition of a post-print: A post-print is the final draft author manuscript, as accepted for publication, including modifications based on referees' suggestions but before it has undergone copyediting and proof correction.
