# **Tunnel Job Gets Underwav**

The Forest Park-Kingshighway intersection will never be the same again. An east-west tunnel is being built under Kingshighway as part of the future Forest Park Parkway, approved by St. Louisans in the 1955 bond issue.

The four-lane project will extend west from Compton avenue and Market street to the St. Louis County line on Millbrook boule-vard. Target date for highway completion: some time in 1962.

Construction workers are now in stage one of a five-stage project to build the tunnel as well as a ramp extending 500 feet east from Kingshighway onto Forest Park avenue.

Kingshighway traffic now uses the two east lanes of the boulevard while bulldozers, cranes, and heavy trucks excavate and sink pilings on

the west side of Kingshighway. Under "first stage" construction are side walls for the tunnel and supports for the bridge and side-walks over it. The first stage should be completed in six to nine months, construction officials estimate. Here is what's going to happen in following stages:

Stage 2: East side of Kingshighway will be excavated, walls built, and the road completed over the underpass so traffic can move both ways on Kingshighway again.

Stage 3: All traffic on the south side of Forest Park avenue will be diverted to the north side of the street. Center parking strip will be torn out all the way to Euclid and a 500-foot ramp onto Forest Park will be built.

Stage 4: Traffic will still use north side of Forest Park avenue. Supporting walls will be completed on south side of ramp. Emergency traffic lane will permit ambulance access to the hospital.

Stage 5: Traffic on Forest Park to be diverted to south side of present avenue. North side wall will be completed and project will be turned over to city for paving.

Dirt from excavation work will fill in the new highway bed west of the intersection so that a bridge over the nearby Frisco railroad tracks can be completed some time within the next two years. Construction officials estimate

that the underpass and ramp work will be completed in 600 working days or in about two years. Future issues of 216 will report construc-tion progress on the intersection and ramp and also on other work projects in the immediate neighborhood.

side of the hospital's third floor.

Visitors to the hospital will notice scaffolding on the 3rd floor construction area immediately east of the present child psychiatry quarters as they enter the hospital by Forest Park ambulance entrance.

The new play room will supplement the present play quarters which are too small. The room will be 49 feet by 83 feet, according to construction officials. Exterior walls will match the existing brick walls of the building.

Construction of the new addition should be completed in January or February of 1961, it has been estimated. The foreman on the project also supervised the seven million dollar remodeling and expansion program of the hospital from 1954 to 1958.

A \$564,518 grant from the U.S. Public Health Service has been awarded to Jewish Hospital and Washington University Social Science Institute, to support studies conducted by a joint Medical Care Research Center. This grant covers a five-year period.

Dr. David Littauer, executive director of Jewish Hospital, is co-investigator of the project with Dr. Nicholas J. Demerath, director of the Social Science Institute of the university.

The purpose of the award is to enable studies that will improve existing methods, or evolve new methods, of organizing and provid-ing patient care at the lowest possible cost.

Specialists from a variety of fields will be brought together to work as a multi-disciplinary t e a m in creating new knowledge in the organization and distribution of hospital and other health services.

Project directors for specific studies will be: Dr. Alvin W. Gouldner, chairman of the univer-sity's department of sociology-anthropology; Dr. Gerald Nadler, chairman, department of industrial engineering; Dr. Burton Weisbrod, assistant professor of economics; Dr. Jay Goldman, assistant professor of industrial engineering; David A. Gee, associate director, Jewish Hospital, and Dr. Albert F. Wessen, assistant professor of sociology and psychiatry at the university and medical sociologist at Jewish Hospital. Dr. Wessen is acting executive director of the center.

the Washington University course in hospital administration; Harry Panhorst and Donald Horsh, both members of the Barnes Hospital administration and Washington University hospital administration course staffs, and Dr. C. Howe Eller, St. Louis County health commissioner.

Research persons in the center will explore medical care programs and their organization—both in hospitals and in similar community institutions.

Also to be examined will be the role of separate medical care units or programs, such as chronic disease, rehabilitation or psychiatric units, in one institution. The influence of units on each other will be studied to determine how each unit affects the over-all policies of the institution.

Other efforts will deal with methods to make medical care organizations more efficient and less expensive. Costs of patient care and factors determining costs will be studied. The design of new systems or improvement of existing methods for providing health care in the general hospital will be considered.

Several studies are already underway at the center. They include a survey of organized h o m e care services for the chronically ill, using the Jewish Hospital home care program as a base. Doctors Littauer, I. J. Flance, and Wessen are cooperating in this study.

Also started is an analysis of patient care components to determine if certain time-consuming activities of nurses can be replaced by simpler, more effective procedures which will release nurses for more essential tasks. Industrial engineers, psychologists, nurses, and sociologists, under the direction of Dr. Nadler, are pooling their talents on this study.

Graduate students from the social sciences, industrial engineering, hospital administration, and medicine will be part-time research assistants at the center. Frequent seminars are held to discuss research problems and results with medical care groups elsewhere. Visiting professorships may be appointed in areas related to center objectives.

# Plans Laid For Medical Center

### Rhinologists Attend Seminar Here

# **New Surgery Unit Here**

With the opening of the recently created Department of Plastic Surgery in the Division of Surgery, Jewish Hospital's teaching program for surgical residents is being expanded.

Surgical residents spend three months on the plastic surgery service, obtaining experience in surgical treatment of burns, head-neck cancers, congenital abnormalities, and other procedures involving reconstructive and/or cosmetic surgery.

Dr. Marcy A. Goldstein is the department's director. Dr. James T. Chamness assists in running the service, and Dr. James B. Brown is senior consultant.

"We are interested only in making general surgery residents aware of the potentials of plastic surgery and teaching them the basic principles of technique," Dr. Goldstein stated. "Many times, plastic surgery overlaps into other fields. Procedures performed by the general surgeon, orthopedist, urologist, or dentist often involve some phase of the plastic surgery field," he explained.


Dr. Goldstein reports that the ultimate aim of his department is to develop a program sufficient in size to eventually obtain an AMAapproved residency in plastic surgery here.






# **Staff Grows**

Studies in diabetes and in diseases of the aged got a recent boost with the addition of two new researchers to the Institute of Experimental Pathology staff.

Dr. Yukimasa Hirata will work in the area of insulin immunity and the vascular diseases of diabetes with Dr. Herman T. Blumenthal, director of the Institute. Dr. Hirata, with his wife and two daughters, will be here two years.

Dr. Bhartur N. Premachandra will work with Dr. Blumenthal in exploring the function of endocrine glands among aged persons. (These glands secrete various hormones which control such bodily functions as growth, metabolism, nutrition, and blood pressure.) 


A native of Bangalor, India, he has been in the United States about five years. He previously did bio-chemistry research at Montreal General Hospital, Quebec.
