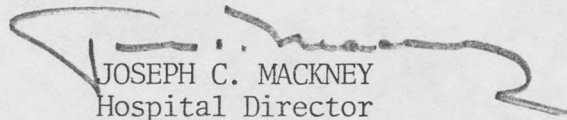
Dear Dean King:

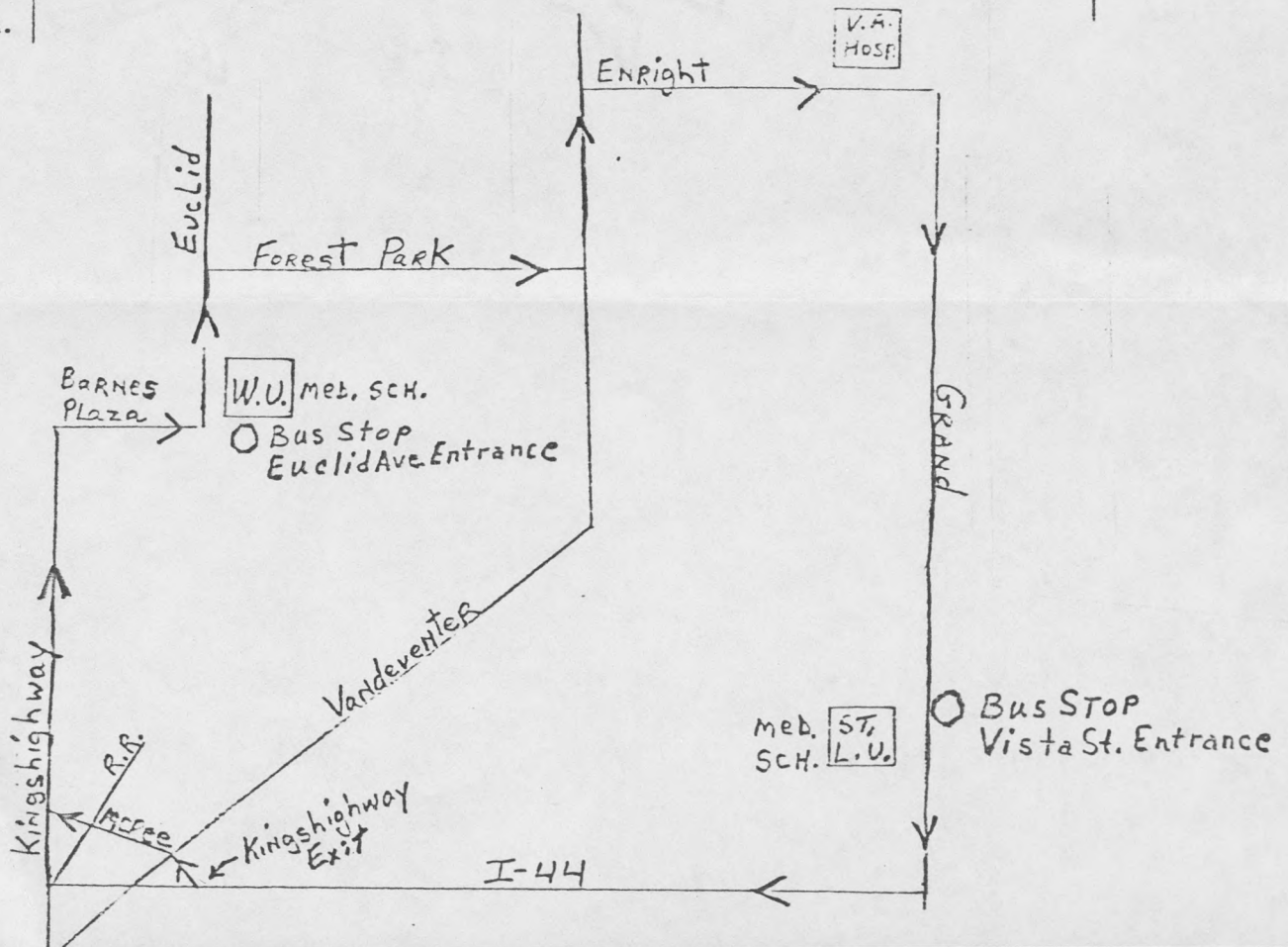
