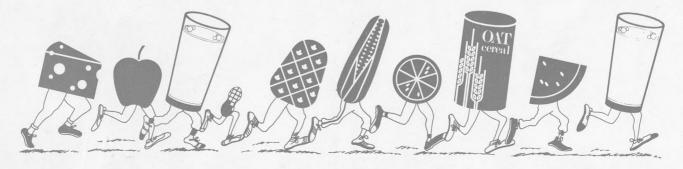

BY-LAWS

ST. LOUIS DISTRICT DAIRY COUNCIL

ARTICLE I

NAME, LOCATION AND OBJECTIVE

Section 1. The name of this Corporation shall be: "St. Louis District Dairy Council."

Section 2. The offices of the Corporation shall be located in such place or places as shall be designated by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. The objective and purpose of the Corporation shall be the promotion of health, human welfare, and efficiency by the means of education in the use of milk and milk products through the collection and dissemination of information thereto.

ARTICLE II

MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The members of the Corporation shall be the subscribers to the Certificate of Incorporation and such persons as may from time to time qualify for membership, or be elected to membership, in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws.

Section 2. The members of the Corporation, shall be representatives of four (4) groups namely: producers, handlers, producer organizations and consumers. The producer members shall be persons in the business of producing milk and who are currently contributing directly or through a producer organization to St. Louis District Dairy Council.

BY-LAWS

ST. LOUIS DISTRICT DAIRY COUNCIL

ARTICLE I

NAME, LOCATION AND OBJECTIVE

Section 1. The name of this Corporation shall be: "St. Louis District Dairy Council."

Section 2. The offices of the Corporation shall be located in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, and in such other place or places as shall be designated by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. The objective and purpose of the Corporation shall be the promotion of health, human welfare, and efficiency by the means of education in the use of milk and milk products through the collection and dissemination of information thereto.

ARTICLE II

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Section 2. The members of the Corporation, shall be representatives of four (4) groups namely: producers, handlers, producer organizations and consumers. The producer members shall be persons in the business of producing milk and who are currently contributing directly or through a producer organization to St. Louis District Dairy Council.

The handler members shall be persons engaged in the business of receiving and/or processing milk or milk products, or who are members of some bona fide organization representing milk handlers, and who are currently contributing to St. Louis District Dairy Council. The producer organization members shall be producer organizations who qualify under the Capper -Volstead Act and who are currently contributing to St. Louis District Dairy Council. The consumer members shall be persons who use fresh milk and milk products and who are elected to membership at the annual meetings of the members. Consumer members shall not be producers or handlers or affiliates of producers or handlers. Section 3. During the interim between the annual meetings of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall have the power to appoint

consumer members to fill vacancies in the consumer membership, and consumer members so appointed shall serve until the next annual meeting.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall have the power during the interim between annual meetings of the Corporation to receive resignations from members and may, after seven (7) days notice and a hearing, expel members for non-compliance with these by-laws or with such rules and regulations as shall have been prescribed by the Board of Directors pursuant to these by-laws, and as are in effect on the date of such notice.

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall have power to elect Honorary Members and Associate Members. Honorary Members and Associate Members shall have the right of attendance and of speech at meetings of the Corporation, but shall not have the right to vote.

ARTICLE III

FINANCES

Section 1. The expenses of the Corporation shall be met by contributions from producer members, from handler members, from producer organization members, and from such other persons or associations as may wish to make contributions to the work of the Corporation.

The consumer members of the Corporation shall not be required to make contributions. The Board of Directors shall have power by resolution to prescribe the amounts and methods of contributions. ARTICLE IV DIRECTORS Section 1. The Board of Directors shall not exceed a total of thirty (30) in number, all of whom shall be members or representatives of members of the Corporation. They shall be elected by the members of the Corporation for a term of one (1) year or until their successors are duly qualified and elected. The Board of Directors shall consist of: Not more than fifteen (15) persons who shall be producers (A) as defined in Article II Section 2. Not more than five (5) persons who are representatives of producer organizations as defined in Article II Section 2. Not more than four (4) persons who shall be handlers or representatives of handler organizations as defined in Article II Section 2. Not more than six (6) persons who shall be consumers as defined in Article II Section 2. A nominating committee appointed by the President shall present a slate of nominees for the Board of Directors as stated above. Additional nominations may be made from the floor. The Directors shall be elected by majority vote of such members as shall attend in person any annual meeting of the Corporation or any special meeting called for that purpose. Section 2. The Board of Directors, immediately following the annual meeting of the Corporation, shall by a majority vote elect from their own number a President, a First, a Second and a Third Vice President, and a Secretary and Treasurer (who may be the same person). All such officers shall hold offices for the term of one (1) year or until their successors are duly qualified and elected. - 3-

Section 3. The Board of Directors shall have the power and authority to appoint such subordinate officers and agents, and such committees as it shall deem proper. The Board of Directors shall have power to name qualified persons to fill vacancies on the Board until the next annual meeting. Section 4. The Board of Directors shall have the power to appoint an Executive Committee consisting of the President, the First, the Second, and the Third Vice President, the Secretary and Treasurer (who may be the same person), and three (3) members of the Board to perform such duties as may be necessary or required during the interim between meetings of the Board. Section 5. Compensation of officers or agents elected by the Board of Directors shall be determined by the Board. No member of the Board of Directors while holding such membership shall receive any salary or other financial compensation for services rendered. The Board of Directors may authorize and approve actual expenses incurred by any officer or agent elected by the Board while conducting business for the Corporation. Section 6. The Board of Directors shall employ an Executive Director to carry out the policies of the Corporation as established by the Board of Directors. ARTICLE V OFFICERS Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the members of the Corporation and all meetings of the Board of Directors and Executive Committee. The President shall perform such other duties as may be incident to the office or may be required by the Board of Directors. Section 2. The Vice Presidents in their order shall perform the duties of the President in his absence and other duties as may be required of them by the Board of Directors. -4-

Section 3. The Secretary shall keep accurate minutes of all meetings, and shall give all notices as may be required by the By-Laws or by the Board of Directors. Section 4. The Treasurer shall be responsible for the collection and dispersements of all moneys paid to and from the Corporation. The Board of Directors or Executive Committee may designate some other person, who need not be a member of the Corporation, to receive and disperse all moneys of the Corporation. However, the Treasurer should receive a record of the amount of deposits and a complete record of expenditures. The Treasurer shall perform such duties as are incident of the office or may be required by the Board of Directors. ARTICLE VI MEETINGS Section 1. The annual meeting of the Corporation for the election of members and directors, and for the transaction of such other business as may be presented at such meeting, shall be held in the City or County of St. Louis or at a place determined by the Board of Directors or Executive Committee within a one hundred and twenty (120) day period following January 1st of each year, or at such other date as may be fixed by the Board of Directors or Executive Committee. Notices of the annual meeting shall be given to all members and all persons or corporations entitled to nominate persons for membership at least ten (10) days before the date of such meeting. Section 2. Notices of the annual meeting shall be given to all members and all persons or corporations entitled to nominate persons for membership at least thirty (30) days before the date of such meeting. Any notice given to the Federal Milk Market Administrator of the area covered by the St. Louis District Dairy Council shall be considered adequate and sufficient notice to all of the producer members who are not members of a producer organization, as required under Section 1 and 2 of Article VI and under Section 1 of Article VII. -5-

Section 3. Special meetings of the members of the Corporation may be called by the President at the request of a majority of the Board of Directors or of the Executive Committee or at the discretion of the President. Notice of such special meetings together with a statement of the business to be transacted shall be given to all members at least ten (10) days prior to the date of such meeting. Section 4. At all meetings of the members of the Corporation a quorum shall consist of not less than ten (10) present in person or by proxy. Section 5. A stated meeting of the Board of Directors for the purpose of electing officers shall be held immediately following the annual meeting of the Corporation. Other meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at such times as the Board of Directors shall determine. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be held at the call of the President, or upon the request of either the Secretary or the Treasurer, or upon the request of one-fifth (1/5) of the members of the Board of Directors. Section 6. At all meetings of the Board of Directors, ten (10) shall be a quorum and at all meetings of the Executive Committee, a majority thereof shall constitute a quorum. ARTICLE VII AMENDMENTS Section 1. These By-Laws may be amended at any annual meeting, or at any special meeting of the members of the Corporation provided the proposed amendment is filed with the Secretary at the Office of the Corporation at least ten (10) days before such annual or special meeting and notice is given by mailing a copy thereof to each member at least seven (7) days before the annual or special meeting. An affirmative vote of a majority of all members present in person or by proxy shall be necessary to the adoption of any amendment. -6-

Section 2. These By-Laws may be amended by the Board of Directors, provided the proposed amendment is filed with the Secretary at the Office of the Corporation at least ten (10) days before the meeting of the Board of Directors and notice is given by mailing a copy thereof to each member at least seven (7) days before such meeting. Any amendment to the By-Laws by the Board of Directors may subsequently be repealed or modified at a special or annual meeting of the members provided proper notice thereof is filed and mailed as provided for in Section 1 of this Article VII. The producer members shall be persons in the business of producing milk and who are currently contributing directly or through a producer organization to St. Louis District The (dealer) members shall be persons engaged in Dairy Council. the business of receiving and/or processing milk or milk products, or who are members of some bona fide organization representing milk holles, and who are currently contributing to St. Louis District Dairy Council. The producer organization members shall be producer organizations who qualify under the Capper-Volstead Act and have been accepted as members of the St. Louis District Dairy Council. The consumer members shall be persons who use fresh milk and milk products and who are elected to membership at the annual meetings of the members. Consumer members shall not be producers or dealers or affiliates of producers or dealers.

Section 3. During the interim between the annual meetings of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall have the power to appoint consumer members to fill vacancies in the consumer membership, and consumer members so appointed shall serve until the next annual meeting.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall have power during the interim between annual meetings of the Corporation to receive resignations from members and may, after seven (7) days notice and a hearing, expel members for non-compliance with these by-laws or with such rules and regulations as shall have been prescribed by the Board of Directors pursuant to these by-laws, and as are in effect on the date of such notice.

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall have power to elect Honorary Members and Associate Members. Honorary Members and Associate Members shall have the right of attendance and of speech at meetings of the Corporation, but shall not have the right to vote.

ARTICLE III

FINANCES

Section 1. members, by producer organization members, by dealer members and by associate members for the purpose of raising funds with which to carry on the objects and purposes of the Corporation. Each producer organization shall pay an annual membership fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) and the Board of Directors shall have power by resolution to change this annual fee in its discretion. ARTICLE IV DIRECTORS Section 1. The business and work of the Corporation shall be conducted and managed by a Board of Directors, not to exceed a total of sixty (30) in number, all of whom shall be members or representatives of members of the Corporation, (and not more than twenty (20) of whom shall represent each of three membership groups, They shall be namely dealers, producer organizations and consumers/. elected by the members of the Corporation for a term of one (1) year or until their successors are duly elected and qualify. The producer organization members may nominate as directors not more than (twenty (20) persons who are members of producer organizations. (B) The dealer members may nominate as directors not more -4than twenty (20) persons who shall be dealers or representatives of dealer organizations. The consumer members may nominate not more than twenty (20) persons as directors who shall be consumers as defined in Article II Section 2. Additional nominations may be made from the floor. The directors shall be elected by majority vote of such members as shall attend in person and at any annual meeting of the corporation or at any special meeting called for that purpose. Section 2. The Board of Directors, immediately following the annual meeting of the Corporation, shall by a majority vote elect from their own number a President, a First, a Second and a Third Vice President, and a Secretary and Treasurer (who may be the same person). All such officers shall hold offices for the terms of one (1) year or until their successors are duly elected and qualified. Section 3. The Board of Directors shall have power and authority to appoint such subordinate officers and agents, and such committees as it shall deem proper. 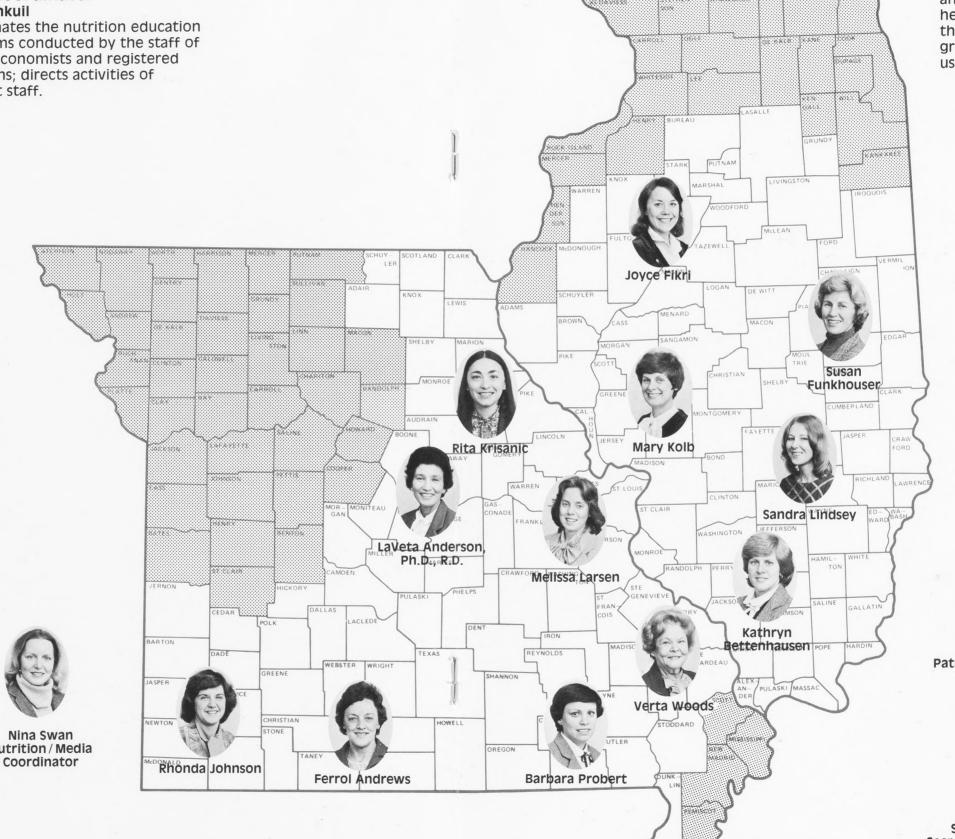

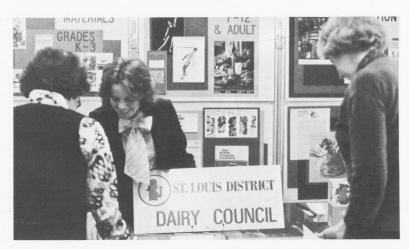
